SAFETY INFORMATION

This manual explains the proper use of your new Electrolux Electrical connection canopy rangehood. Please read this manual carefully before using the product. This manual should be kept in a safe place for handy reference.

This rangehood is a domestic appliance which has been manufactured and tested to comply with International Standard IEC 60335.2.31.

Read the following carefully to avoid damage or injury.

Follow these instructions carefully to avoid an electric shock or fire

- \oslash Young children should be supervised to ensure they do not play with the rangehood.
- \bigcirc This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical. sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- \oslash Ensure the rangehood is switched off before carrying out maintenance, to avoid any possibility of electric shock.
- 0 Never carry out flambe cooking under the rangehood.
- \bigcirc This rangehood is not recommended for barbecues.
- \bigcirc This rangehood cannot be installed for external use.
- \bigcirc Grease filters must be removed every four weeks (maximum) for cleaning to reduce the risk of fire.
- \bigcirc The exhaust from the rangehood must not be discharged into any heating flue, which may carry combustion products from other sources.(Fig.1)
- \odot The exhaust air must not be discharged into a wall cavity, unless the cavity if designed for the purpose.
- \oslash There must be adequate ventilation of the room when the rangehood is used at the same time as appliances burning gas or other fuels.
- \oslash Always cover lit gas burners with pots or pans when rangehood is in use.
- \oslash Always switch off gas burners before you remove pots or pans.
- \bigcirc Do not leave lit gas burners exposed due to the risk of fire.(Fig.2)

Check that the mains voltage matches with the voltage on the data plate inside the rangehood. Check that the installation complies with standards of local building, gas and electrical authorities. Before connecting to the mains supply ensure that the mains voltage corresponds to the voltage on the rating plate inside the rangehood. If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent or similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard

Safety warnings For the installer


When installing the rangehood, make sure you adhere to the minimum and maximum distances from the rangehood base to the hob surface (as per table on page 6).

Exhaust flue installation: The following rules must be strictly followed to obtain optimal air extraction.

- Keep exhaust flue short and straight
- Do not reduce the size or restrict exhaust flue.
- Keep bends in the exhaust flue to a minimum.
- When using flexible flue always install duct with helix pulled taut to minimise pressure loss.
- · Failure to observe these basic instructions will drastically reduce the performance and increase the noise levels of the range hood.

Exhaust air must not be discharged into a wall cavity, unless the cavity is designed for the purpose. The exhaust from the cooker hood must not be discharged into any heating flue, which may carry combustion products from other sources.

NOTE: Some installations may require the telescopic exhaust cover to be cut to length. Cut with sharp tin snips or a fine-tooth hack saw blade, taking are not to distort or dent the exhaust cover.




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

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RANGEHOOD INSTALLATION

iBEFORE INSTALLATION

Before the installation of the appliance, record the information below from the rating plate. The rating plate is on the bottom of the appliance casing.

 Using a spirit level mark a vertical centre line on the wall where the cooker hood is to be positioned, and a horizontal line at the cooker hood base position (refer diagram below).


NOTE: The height of the underside of the hood body must be a minimum of **650mm**^{*} to a maximum height of **800mm**

* If the instructions of the hob specify a greater distance than the minimum above, then that shall be the minimum height for installation.


 Mark the location for flue cover wall mounting brackets and cooker hood mounting points above the hood base as the reference point (Fig. 6).



3. Install the flue cover mounting and wall brackets with screws to the wall as marked(Fig.7).



4. Remove protective plastic film, if present, from the hood body and hang on the wall bracket.




5. Ducted mode air exhaust system(Fig.9).

To reduce the risk of fire , use metal ductwork only

Attached an adequate length of $\phi 170 \text{mm}$ round duct into the recessed area of the air outlet adapter.

The duct have to be secured using two screws from two sides of the air outlet adapter. Make sure the duct is fixed well on.

6. Electrical connection

- Electrical wring must be done by a qualified person(s) in accordance with all applicable codes and standards. Turn off electrical power at service entrance before wiring.
- If the power cord is damaged, it must be replaced by manufacturer, its agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid hazard.
- Do not use the plug and an extension cord other than the ones initially supplied with the hoods.
- The earthing of this hood is compulsory. Do not remove the ground prong of the plug.



7. Installation of telescopic flue covers


Slide up the top flue cover. Fix top flue cover to the mounting bracket with screws supplied.(Fig.10) Ensure that the upper section is extended.

NOTE: Carefully remove the plastic protective coating, if present, from the flue covers. Pay particular attention when removing protective plastic coating from decals.



USING THE RANGE HOOD

A	Turns on/off the range hood. Turns off Self-Cleaning function during Self-Cleaning process.	On/Off
в	Turns the motor on at speed low (1), medium (2) and high (3).	On/Off
с	Turns the motor on at maximum speed. This speed is timed to run for 1 minute. At the end of this time, the system will automatically return to the speed set before. Suitable to deal with maximum levels of cooking fumes.	On/Off
D	Turns the lighting system on and off	On/Off
E	Delay Function Activates/Deactivates automatic switch-off with a 5 minutes delay. Suitable to complete elimination of residual odours. Can be activated with any fan speed except when Boost Fan Speed is in use.	Flash when activated/Off
F	Self-Cleaning Function Activates Self-Cleaning with short press.	Flash when activated

Note: 1. In order to activate the function, press on the symbols.


- 2. The closing lid sound of "pub" is normal after power off hood, it means the lid re-setting completely to prevent smoke flow back.
- 3. It is normal that a little water drops on the glass worktop while the cleaning function is running.

Always ensure the oil cup is installed properly before operating the range hood.

Self-Cleaning Function

 Do NOT mix any detergent into the water container for self-cleaning. This can cause water pump damage.
 Do NOT carry out any cooking or have naked flames under the cooker hood when self-clean is activated.
 Ensure to fill the water container to the minimal level of water mark MIN, in the correct cavity.

Always install a correctly filled up water container before activating the Self-Clean function to prevent damages to the Self-Clean system.



Auto Self-Clean will alert every 15 hours of usage in order to maintain the range hood performance.

During power ON state, the self-cleaning icon CLEAN Will blink on the display every 15 hours of motor usage until Self-Cleaning button is activated.

Self-Clean Instruction:

1. Remove oil cup. (Fig. 11)



2.Fill the water container in the cavity as marked. (Fig. 12)

Ensure to fill the water container to the minimal level as marked $\underset{MIN}{\text{MIN}}$ to prevent damages to the Self-Clean system.


- It is not recommended to add detergent due to it might affect material of heating element.
- 3. Install water container to the range hood.



• Ensure the water container is fully pushed in so that the water tube is properly connected.

4. Activate Self-Clean by pressing the button

once (Fig. 14)



5. Self-Clean process will take 18 minutes.

- When finished, the display will show "End".
- To cancel during the Self-Cleaning process, press for 3 seconds OR press ① once.
- 6. Pour out dirty water from the water container.
- For second cleaning, add clean water to water container and repeat steps 3 to 6.
- 7.Re-install the oil cup after cleaning before using the range hood. (Fig. 15)



Self-Cleaning process will stop when abnormal temperature is detected due to low water in the water container. The Icon on the display will flash accompanied with an alarm sound.

- To discontinue the Self-Cleaning process, press CLEAN for 3 seconds OR press () once.

Setting the Clock

- 1. To set the clock, press and hold 谈 and ④ buttons together for 3 seconds to enter the clock setting mode during standby state. The Hour digits and colon will blink.
- 2.To set the Hour, press ⅔ button to decrease the value and ④ to increase the value.
- Wait 1 second to set the Hour. Then the Minute digits and colon will then blink.
- 4. To set the Minute, press 说 to decrease the value and ④ to increase the value.
- 5. Wait 1 second to complete the clock setting when the digits and colon stop flashing.

MAINTENANCE AND CLEANING

Switch off or unplug the appliance from the main supply before carrying out any maintenance work.

GREASE FILTER

- The grease filters should be cleaned frequently (every two months of operation ,or more frequently for heavy use). Use a warm detergent solution.
- · Grease filters are washable, Remove the grease filter by hand. Wash the filters, taking care not to bend them. Allow them to be dry before refitting. To install the grease filter ,push the filter into position by hand.

LED lamp

- This range hood requires one LED lamp (DC 12V ,Max.2W)
- · Kick off the LED lamps by using the flat screw driver(Fig 16).
- Disconnect the lamp socket .
- Replace with DC12V, 2W Max.LED lamp.



- 1 Always switch off the electrical supply before carrying out any operation on the appliance.
- 2. Only a qualified and trained service technician can undertake the work of lamp replacement and servicing.

• THE SURFACE, THE COVER OF THE LED LAMPS MAY BE HOT. TAKE CARE WHEN TAKING THE REPLACEMENT.
